Project Description: The proposed communications project will construct a 152 sq. ft. lease area at the garage level and 197 sq. ft. antenna lease area on the rooftop of an existing 1,215 sq. ft. commercial structure. Verizon contractor to place (9) new wireless antennas, (1) new 2-foot MW antenna, (12) new wireless radios, and (2) new raycaps within (1) new screen wall enclosure. Additionally, (1) new Appleton receptacle, (1) new meter pedestal, (3) new 6" bollards, and (4) new removable bollards at meter pedestal located at the lower west elevation. The 10'9"-tall screen wall will be finished with stucco and is not anticipated to impact public views to the ocean ("blue water views").
