#### **Crime Safety Tips**

#### **Securing Your Bicycle**

Choose a bike lock that meets your needs. If you're only leaving your bike for a short time to go to the coffee shop, a simple lightweight cable lock may be sufficient for a quick stop. However, a sturdier, heavy-duty chain lock will provide maximum security when you have to leave your bike unattended all day or overnight.

Even the best of locks won't be effective if you do not properly lock your bike. For maximum security, your lock cable or chain should be long enough to wrap around the bike's frame, both wheels, and whatever you are

- 6. ON ONE OF THE REAR STAYS (Left or Right)

locking your bike to. If you just lock one of your wheels to something, then a thief can remove the wheel and take the rest of the bike. If you only lock the frame, then your wheels are vulnerable. If you can't include both wheels, wrap the lock around the frame and the front wheel. Remember, you want to make it as difficult a target as possible.

Utilizing bike racks are optimal, but when one is not available, secure your bike to an enclosed object that won't allow for the lock to be slipped off. If you have to use a free-standing pole, make sure it's tall enough that your bike can't be lifted over the top.

Keep a file that includes a photo of your bike and the serial number. This will be helpful in returning recovered bikes to their rightful owners. In the event your bike is not recovered, a receipt will also be helpful for insurance purposes.

#### **Securing Your Vehicle and Garages**

We all know that thieves are opportunists and always looking for an easy target. Don't make it easy for them by leaving your vehicle unlocked, or by keeping valuable items in plain sight. Never leave mail, jewelry, cash, electronics, or any items of value out in plain sight. Even if you do lock your vehicle, it is vulnerable to a break in when valuables are in plain sight.

No matter where you park your vehicle, it should always be locked with the windows rolled up. If you have to leave items in your car, lock them in your trunk.

Open garages are a welcoming sight to thieves. It only takes a few seconds to become a victim of a crime. When your garage is unattended it's advisable to keep the doors closed and locked. This is especially true at night, but daylight will not deter a thief.
